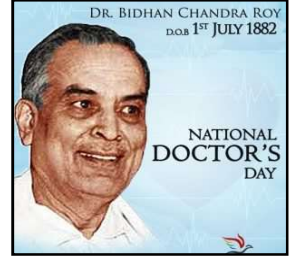


National Doctors Day

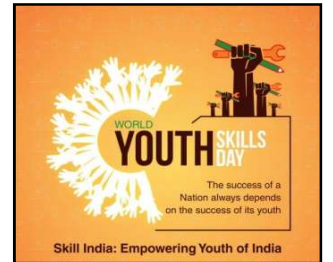
Many doctors and healthcare workers laid down their lives protecting the people from this infection. The society is indebted to their selfless service to humanity.

Kargil Vijay Diwas

Kargil Vijay Diwas (Kargil Victory Day) is commemorated on 26th July in India, to observe India's victory over Pakistan in the Kargil War. Indian Forces ousted the Pakistani Forces from their occupied positions on the mountain tops of Northern Kargil District in Ladakh in 1999. Initially, the Pakistani army denied their involvement in the war, claiming that it was caused by Kashmiri militant forces. However documents left behind by casualties, testimony of POWs and later statements by the Prime Minister of Pakistan, Nawaz Sharif and Pakistan Army Chief of Army Staff, Pervez Musharraf showed the involvement of Pakistani paramilitary forces, led by General Ashraf Rashid.

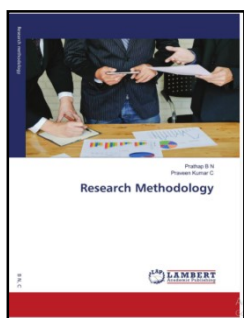


Kargil War Memorial

GSSS SSFGC's Faculty Member Co-authors Textbook

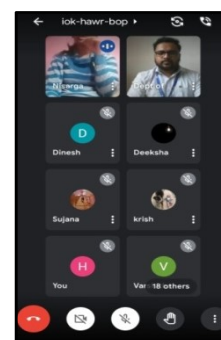

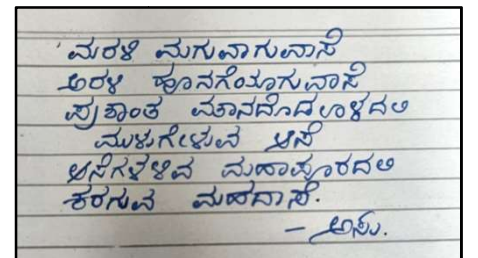
