A Special Lecture was organized on 4 th January 2020 in the College. Nivedan Nimpe, Make- in- India Excellency Awardee, was the resource person. He is a graduate in pharmacy and a post graduate in Manufacturing and Management Technology (Australia).

Mr. Nivedan Nimpe while addressing the students said “Business is nothing but solving problems and creating demand. Self confidence is the important quality to become an entrepreneur”.

He defined Management as managing ME and Manage MEN- managing human resource (means of support to organization) and last letter ‘T’ stands for Teamwork in management.

His company ‘Mystic Aromatics’ introduced a product ‘Perfumed Papers’ as a startup in Mandagadde but failed to get success. Later, Perfumery card business brought him success. The next venture was production of Air Fresheners, and failed again. He became popular when he started Areca Tea business. This Tea has diabetes reversing capacity. Today, he is exporting Areca Tea to more than 14 countries worldwide.

Gowamma and the cook cum nurse Smt. Sarojamma.
